We joined with fellow advocates in regulatory comment letters/petitions:

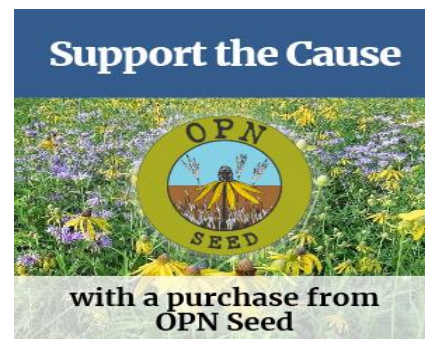
