Amid rising concern about the decimation of bees and butterflies — the small but mighty pollinators responsible for one in three bites of food we eat — retailers are beginning to step up to address the routine and unnecessary use of toxic pesticides in their supply chains. The same pesticides that threaten pollinators also harm human health. To spur a race to the top, Friends of the Earth created a retailer scorecard benchmarking 25 of the largest U.S. grocery stores on pesticides, organic offerings and pollinator health.

Six major U.S. grocery retailers have adopted pollinator health policies, including three of the four largest: Kroger, Costco and Albertsons. They are joined by Giant Eagle, Aldi U.S. and Rite Aid.

Only Giant Eagle has made a clear commitment to reduce use of toxic pesticides. In advance of the scorecard release, Giant Eagle established a policy that commits to eliminate pollinator-toxic neonicotinoid pesticides from its produce supply chain. **READ MORE**
