During 2021 we provided two webinar series: Log-In To Learn, and Creating Pollinator Habitat featuring a variety of speakers from across the United States with topics ranging from small business

ACTION

2021 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

We continue our work on two coalitions concerned about the impact of pesticides upon pollinators. We co-signed in support of 27 actions with fellow pollinator advocacy groups at the federal and state level. We are an integral member of the MASSQuito Coalition in Massachusetts to address concerns about pesticide applications for mosquito control.

We provided virtual testimony to the Rhode Island House and Senate to restrict usage of Neonicotinoid pesticides.

We worked with a local coalition securing new beekeeping and urban agricultural ordinances for the City of Hudson, Ohio. We continue to work with the City of Akron, Ohio and the Summit Food Coalition to revise the urban agricultural ordinances, including the beekeeping ordinance and noxious weed ordinances.
