- Renewed effort to address City of Akron's noxious weed, devilstrip plantings, beekeeping and urban ag ordinances.
 - Secured recognition of Pollinator Week Resolution and recognizing the late Councilman Rich Swirsky's environmental contributions (June 2021)
 - Determined to break ordinances into small parts: noxious weeds, devilstrip plantings, beekeeping, farm
 - Began petition to encourage City to change their ordinances to support pollinators (June 2021)

7. Policy Actions Taken:

- 1) 1-25-21 with the Center for Biological Diversity and Congressional members to US Fish and Wildlife- seek Monarchs listed as Endangered Species
- 2) 2-2-21 with Beyond Pesticides to US Fish and Wildlife seeking Monarchs listed as Endangered Species
- 3) 2-2-21 with EarthJustice urging the EPA to immediately revoke all food tolerances for chlorpyrifos and initiate the cancellation process to end all uses of this toxic pesticide.
- 4) 2-9-21 Signed on to NOFA/Mass letter to MDAR to ban neonics

- 5) 2-17-21 signed onto letter with Ctr for Biological Diversity expressing strong support for the EPA to issue a robust and protective final biological evaluation for atrazine under the Endangered Species Act (ESA).
- 6) 2-18-21 join with numerous NGOs in a letter to the US Fish and Wildlife to re-instate the National Wildlife Refuge System prohibition adopted in 2014 on certain practices for the limited agriculture that occurs within our nation's Wildlife Refuges. That prohibition applied to the planting of genetically modified (GM) crops and use of the systemic neonicotinoid insecticides in or on crops within the Refuges;
- 7) 3-8-21 Signed onto letter also with PEER to USFWS concerning pesticides and GMPs on wildlife refuge land
- 8) 3-11-21 with Ctr for Biological Diversity a letter to urge the EPA to issue a robust and protective final biological evaluation for glyphosate under the Endangered Species Act (ESA).
- 9) 3-17-21 signed onto XERCES Society sponsored Coalition Letter of Support for the Monarch Action, Recovery, and Conservation of Habitat Act, or MONARCH Act, of 2021.
